Car: 1966 Mustang Convertible body and \$10,000 worth of reproduction parts furnished by Scott Drake Enterprises of Henderson, NV.

Engine: 302 Cubic inch Ford V-8 with Ford Racing aluminum heads and intake furnished by Quantum Performance of Farmers Branch, Texas. Proform Ultralite Performance carburetor from Ortigo Performance, Tyler, TX. Headers, valve covers, air cleaners from Scott Drake Enterprises.

Transmission: Ford C-4 Automatic with 400-600 over stock stall converter furnished by Performance Automatic of Gaithersburg, MD.

Sound System: Custom Autosound radio with MP3 and CD capability from Scott Drake Enterprises and Kicker Performance Audio custom amplifier, two 6 1/2" speakers, two tweeters and one trunk mounted sub-woofer. MP3 or iPod jack mounted in the center console.

Air Conditioning: Complete heating, ventilation and air-conditioning system including a polished compressor furnished by Old Air Products, Inc. of Ft Worth, Texas. This system features all electronic controls in the place of the original heater controls.

Tires: Five new B.F. Goodrich TA radial tires furnished by Bill Day Tire of Tyler, Texas and mounted on reproduction Styled Steel Wheels from Scott Drake Enterprises.

Interior: Complete set of front and rear leather upholstery, quarter panels and boot from Distinctive Industries of Commerce, CA. Carpet, kick panels, instrument cluster, glove box, etc. from Scott Drake Enterprises.

A teacher who made a difference in the life of entrepreneur Scott Drake inspired a chain of kindness that will now help hundreds of women and children escaping abuse – all with the help of some car guys and an old abandoned Mustang.

In honor of the 45th anniversary of the Ford Mustang, Scott Drake Enterprises, an after-market Mustang parts company, held the nationwide “Pay It Forward” contest, in which the winning chapter of the Mustang Club of America would be awarded an un-restored 1966 Mustang Convertible and \$10,000 worth of parts in exchange for the promise of full restoration, selling the car and giving all the money to a charity. The Mustangs of East Texas submitted the winning application in the form of a book that outlined their full restoration plans and schedule and their plans to donate the money to the East Texas Crisis Center, an organization that provides shelter and advocacy to victims of domestic violence and sexual assault.

With restoration complete, the club is showing the car in the Scott Drake booth at Las Vegas’ SEMA (Specialty Equipment Marketing Association), the world’s largest after-market car show. The car will then be auctioned in January at Barrett Jackson Auto Auction in Scottsdale, Arizona, the world’s largest and most prestigious auto auction.

“Getting into Barrett Jackson was the best possible finale for this project,” says Carrie Brantley, Special Events Coordinator for the East Texas Crisis Center. “The awareness from such a huge event is great for the Crisis Center and even better for boosting the sale of the car.” Craig Chesley, coordinator for the project, says the auction will bring a lot of publicity to the car and to its buyer – hopefully increasing the sales price. “The ultimate goal is to make as much money as possible for the Crisis Center,” says Chesley.

The club rounded up more than twenty additional sponsors who have donated everything from the car’s engine to leather interior – a rare custom luxury for a vintage Mustang. The money from the sale of the car will help fund services such as safe shelter, economic education, legal advocacy and children’s programs for victims in East Texas. Physical violence is estimated to occur in 4 to 6 million intimate relationships each year in the United States.
